Mickey has trained in Florida before and is very knowledgeable about Trauma Informed Care. Mickey is the Strategic Advisor at Casey Family Programs and will provide training that will focus on the impact of trauma on youth in foster care, the link between trauma and the child's behavior and how to create a trauma focused system of care. A smaller, more intensive training will also be provided in the afternoon to incorporate what was taught in the earlier session into the infrastructure of Permanency Round Tables. The training will be more skill building work and will focus on how to incorporate a trauma lens into practice. In this smaller group, actual case examples will be used and an opportunity to practice asking the right questions as well as role-playing will be given. Toolkit for Modifying Evidence-Based Practices to Increase Cultural Competence

Drawing upon information from The Toolkit for Modifying Evidence-Based Practices to Increase Cultural Competence, the main goal of this course is to systematically consider modifications to EBPs for cultural groups to improve outcomes for clients regardless of their cultural group. The information in this training is relevant to social service providers and health care workers of all experience levels who wish to provide best practices in cultural competence. To teach you how to use the Toolkit, you will use a combination of experiential exercises, instructive information, and detailed case examples. ***FL-CB approved**

Discrimination in the Workplace: What Supervisors Need to Know

Supervisors in any employment setting have the responsibility to understand how to select, promote, and accommodate employees without discrimination. This training was revised by Mary Wang, J.D. to provide learners with clear guidance regarding the major federal discrimination laws enforced by the U.S. Equal Opportunity Commission (EEOCC).

HIV/AIDS

While over a million people in the United States are living with HIV and AIDS and these diseases continue to be a significant problem, antiretroviral therapies have helped HIV positive individuals to live longer lives. This course has been revised to target a broad target audience such as managers, health professionals, and community advocates to provide key information regarding the epidemiology, pathology, prevention, and treatment options for people with HIV/AIDS. Nancy Lugo, DrPH, APRN revised this course. Dr. Lugo is a family nurse practitioner and public health expert who has developed community based HIV testing programs, community health worker programs, and programs for people with AIDS. ***FL-CB approved**

Broward's Quality Parenting Initiative (QPI) 2012

The 2012 Quality Parenting Initiative in Broward is a project staffed and supported by the Youth Law Center, the Department of Children & Families and ChildNet. Participants for all sessions should include: Foster Parents, Child Welfare Case Managers, Child Placing Agency staff, Child Protective Investigators, Children's Legal Services, Judiciary and Court Administration, Guardian ad Litem Program, birth parents, youth

Session Dates and Descriptions

- May 3rd: Carole will work with the group from the first meeting to condense its work products into several statements specific to the local foster parent brand.
- May 23rd: Deb and Carole will facilitate a 5-hour workshop on implementing or "living" the brand. Includes a comprehensive discussion of how the entire system of care needs to support, and not undermine, the brand.
- June 20th: Carole facilitates the entire group's development of an action plan to implement Broward's specific brand of foster parenting. May also be offered in both afternoon and evening sessions


