Dying to Ask for Help: Suicide Trends and Treatment Disparities Among U.S. Adolescents

Course Description: The suicide rates for Black children ages 5 to 11 has exceeded that of any other ethnic group, according to new research by Dr. Michael Lindsey. He will present this data along with the disparate health outcomes between Blacks and Whites tied to socioeconomic issues, poverty, nutrition, violence, and racism. This webinar will review signs and symptoms of depression, suicide and anxiety in Black children. It will also explore the importance of access to care, particularly school mental health services, as well as preventive measures.

Live Case Consultation:Safety Plans

Consultations are recommended for Front Line Child Welfare Professionals. Hours obtained from these Consultations may be used towards Florida Certification Board (FCB) re-certification hours.

Course Description: Consultations are an opportunity to discuss live cases with other frontline Child Welfare Professionals in a positive, structured, collaborative atmosphere. Participants must be prepared to discuss the sufficiency of an identified Safety Plan on their case load, receive constructive feedback, and reciprocate. Participants are responsible for relaying the group feedback to their direct Supervisor for consideration. Safety Practice Experts and Co-Located Advocates (for identified Intimate Partner Violence cases) will be available to offer guidance on CFOP application and implementation. Consultations are not Practice Model "Booster" Support Sessions.

National Webinar: Understanding the Impact of Trauma on Behavior



This training is recommended by Florida's Center for Child Welfare. Training credits obtained may be eligible towards Florida Certification Board (FCB) recertification hours.

Course Description: Trauma in young children is much more pervasive—and much more destructive—than we ever thought. The research on trauma has made it clear that children's challenging behavior is not intentional, but is instead driven by fear and a protective strategy for coping with their experience. Working with children with challenging behavior and especially those who've experienced trauma is probably the most stressful aspect of the teaching profession which can result in secondary traumatic stress (STS), the symptoms of which can mimic those of post-traumatic stress disorder. In this webinar you will: Develop an understanding of trauma and how it affects behavior; Learn ways to support children who have been traumatized; Develop strategies to promote your own resilience.
